

Genesis 26:12-33 (from "Shine On: A Story Bible) Isaac and the wells

Isaac, Rebekah, and their children settled in the land of Gerar. God blessed Isaac. His crops grew bountifully and he became rich. He had many animals and servants. Even though the land was dry, Isaac had wells with plenty of water.
